Adam Feldman & Rowan McCann



Adam Feldman and Rowan McCann are Co-Founders and Directors of Bright Green Projects, an Agile Project Management Consultancy based in London. Bright Green Projects was founded 18 months ago and in this time have built and launched a cloud-based Agile Project Management Tool, used by many organisations in the UK, US, Europe and Asia. Bright Green also provides Professional Services such as Consulting, Project Management and Agile Training in the UK and Australasia.

Adam and Rowan will give a brief introduction of Agile and how it can be used on Software Development Projects within an Enterprise Environment. Self-Organising Teams are a core component of Agile Projects. Rowan and Adam will also discuss the concepts of self-organising teams and how the role of the Traditional Project Manager changes in this environment.

Before forming Bright Green Projects, Adam and Rowan were Management Consultants with Deloitte Consulting. Between them they have worked on many large CRM and ERP Implementations with many leading organisations including Barclays Bank, Santander, IBM, Toshiba, Westpac Bank, Telstra, Christies Auctions, Ofcom and Tata Consultancy Services.

Martin began his interest in project management when a consultant with PA Consulting Group. He trained as an engineer and has wide experience as an HR director and management tutor. Martin is Director of Professional Development for PMI's UK Chapter and CEO of EngagementWorks. He is a contributor to the project management standards of both PMI and APM

Many observers refer to the urgent need for project managers to develop their human and organisational abilities. The presentation will endorse this and offer some solutions. But will this be enough to reduce the high proportion of projects that under-deliver or fail? (ref. Standish et al). No he claims: it will not. Martin has been working with a group of experienced practitioners calling themselves the 'EngagementWorks Community of Practice' to trace the causes of project weakness and to re-invent the methods by which projects can be (and have been), managed with success. He plans to work with the meeting to develop a radically new model that recognises that the ability of the project manager is not the only factor determining project success. There are many other crucial factors; including interests, other players, circumstances, values, behaviours and governance, on which the success of projects also depend.

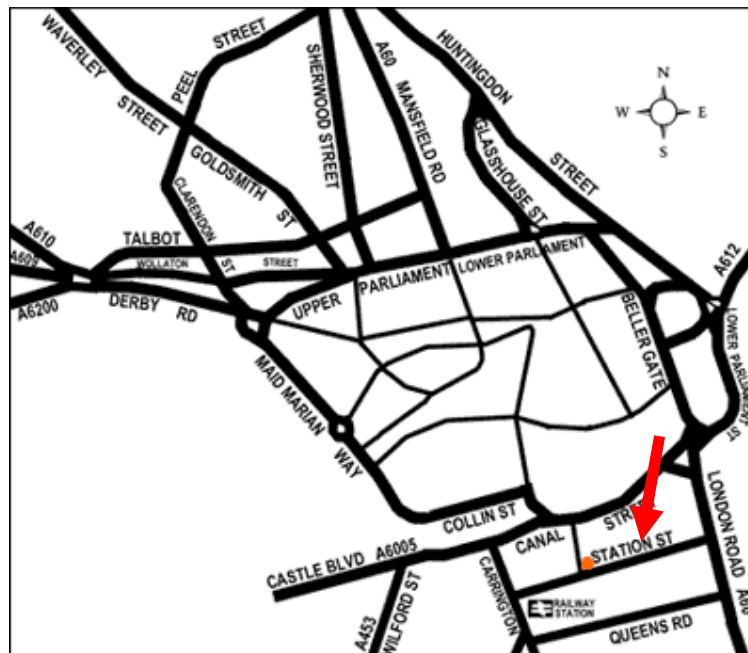

From the south:

- ◆ At Junction 24 of the M1 take the A453 (T) to Nottingham. Follow the A453 (T) to the A60. The A60 goes straight into Nottingham and becomes London Road. After passing the Trent Bridge Cricket Stadium on your left, drive over Trent Bridge and then turn left into Station Street. Trent House is on the right-hand side.

From the north:

- ◆ At junction 26 of the M1, take the A610 Signposted Nottingham. Turn left onto the A6130 Signposted Mansfield. At roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A6130 Signposted City Centre, Grantham. At roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A60 Signposted City Centre. Turn right on Lower Parliament Street. At roundabout take the 1st exit onto the A60 Signposted Loughborough, Melton A606, Grantham A52. At traffic signals bear right onto the A6019 Signposted Station

Parking – there is no parking on site at Capital One, but there are several car parks within a couple of minutes walk:

- ◆ Nottingham train station
- ◆ Broadmarsh Shopping Centre, NG1 4AF
- ◆ NCP - 18 Queen's Bridge Road, NG2 1NB
- ◆ On street parking – Station Street/Trent Street

Travelling by rail or tram is most convenient as Capital One is located next to the railway station.
